Growing Into Responsibility

The past few months, our house has been a little louder than usual.

We added a puppy to the family.

If you've ever brought home a puppy, you know the feeling, equal parts excitement and chaos. There's the early optimism, "This will be great." And then there's the first 3 a.m. whimper, the chewed shoe, the accident on the rug.

What strikes me most isn't the disruption. It's the realization of responsibility. This small animal now depends on us completely. It doesn't negotiate. It doesn't understand convenience. It simply trusts that we will show up.

Recently, my son started Little League. Watching him step onto the field for the first time, glove slightly too big, nerves barely contained, I was struck by a different kind of responsibility. Not the responsibility to control the outcome, but the responsibility to be present. To teach. To encourage. To let him grow through the process.

And as I approach my twentieth year in practice, I've found myself reflecting on how responsibility evolves. Early in my career, responsibility meant proving myself. Building a practice. Taking care of patients well. Learning constantly. Staying afloat.

Somewhere along the way, it shifted.

Responsibility became less about what I could build for myself, and more about what I was helping build for others; for patients, for younger doctors, and for the profession that gave me a career I'm deeply grateful for. That shift feels subtle when it happens. But it changes everything.

Marcus Aurelius wrote, "What we do now echoes in eternity." He wasn't speaking about grand gestures. He was reminding us that the weight of our actions lies in their consistency, not their scale.

The chiropractic profession in New Mexico is much the same.

None of us individually carries it. But all of us collectively shape it. The doctors who came before us fought battles most of us never had to face: licensure recognition, reimbursement legitimacy, scope protection and advancement. Because they showed up consistently, we inherited stability.

Now we are the ones holding that responsibility.

And responsibility rarely feels dramatic. It looks like attending a meeting when you're tired. Supporting legislative efforts even when you're busy. Mentoring a young doctor without expecting recognition. Staying engaged even when progress feels slow. It looks a lot like raising a puppy. Or coaching from the sidelines. Small, repeated acts of presence.

What I've come to understand, nearly twenty years into practice, is that professions aren't preserved by accident. They're strengthened by steady hands. By doctors who care enough to remain involved, not because it's easy, but because it matters.

The NMCA does important work. But it is not the board that determines the future of chiropractic in New Mexico. It is the collective willingness of its members to take ownership of where we are headed.

We do not need everyone to do everything. But we do need everyone to care.

Because one day, sooner than we realize, we

will look up and see the next generation stepping onto the field. Their gloves might be a little too big. Their confidence is still forming. And what they inherit will depend on what we choose to protect, strengthen, and advance.

Responsibility is not a burden. It is a privilege.

It is the quiet privilege of shaping something that will outlast us.

And it is an honor to share that responsibility with each of you.

Vice President's Report

Springtime in New Mexico means the beginning of back country skiing! This involves having the right equipment to ski up the mountain with transitional bindings and boots. “Skins” are sticky pieces of material that used to be made from animal skin that are placed on the bottom of your skis to give traction. You must bring an avalanche beacon to find other skiers who might get buried in an avalanche, or for others to find you. An avalanche probe, and a good shovel are also necessary for one to have in the back country.

The best places to ski during the spring are also the most dangerous parts of the mountain, the avalanche zones. The idea is to mitigate the risks by paying attention to all the signs, look for the perfect time and temperature, as well as to have all the equipment and the training to find the perfect line to hike up and ski down. The Representatives and Senators had to work on the Medical Malpractice Law, the interstate compacts, and several other issues that are not directly related to healthcare this year. We would have loved to pass a bill to restart the Advanced Practice Certification, and to go another step further to give a pathway to full primary care. What we decided to introduce was a memorial to lay out a pathway to get there. Thank you to our

sponsor Majority Whip Day Hochman Vigil for introducing House Memorial 63. You can think of it as a roadmap to the next step in our legislative journey. For now, we will keep hiking up the mountain!

Dr. Pridham in conjunction with Representative Hochman-Vigil, was able to get a 'Memorial' introduced in the short session regarding Chiropractic Scope Expansion. This allows for an FIR to be created and puts us in a favorable position for the upcoming full session. There have been some committee chair changes that favor our efforts. Other areas of focus include: Any Willing Provider legislation, Qualified Medical Personnel (concussion and return to play), Gross Receipts Tax and Student Loan Forgiveness. NMCA President Dr. JC Moore continues to concentrate on improving the Chiropractic Medicaid re-imburement. On the Federal Level, Drs. Ryan Rowse and Michael Pridham have made great strides regarding the Medicare Chiropractic Modernization Act by getting ALL New Mexico Legislators to co-sign the Bill! Dr. Robert Jones had been appointed to the Board of the World Chiropractic Federation.

ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE IN CHIROPRACTIC: BOOSTING EFFICIENCY OR RAISING RED FLAGS?

Introduction

Love it or hate it, artificial intelligence (AI) is here to stay and will continue to expand rapidly. AI technologies are already transforming multiple areas of healthcare, from diagnostics to administrative workflow. The Harvard School of Public Health has reported that AI-assisted diagnostic systems may significantly improve diagnostic accuracy and clinical outcomes in certain settings. In addition to diagnostic support, AI tools can assist clinicians with tasks such as generating draft chart notes, summarizing clinical information, and helping analyze complex clinical scenarios.

It is easy to see how AI could help detect medication interactions or synthesize medical literature, but can it help a Doctor of Chiropractic? And what challenges should clinicians consider before integrating AI tools into their practice?

Across healthcare professions, clinicians are beginning to explore how artificial intelligence tools can support clinical reasoning, improve workflow efficiency, and enhance patient communication.

In the evolving landscape of healthcare, chiropractic practices are increasingly turning to technology to enhance efficiency and improve patient outcomes. One of the most promising developments is the integration of AI tools that may support clinical decision-making, documentation, and personalized treatment planning. When implemented thoughtfully, AI technologies can assist Doctors of Chiropractic in delivering evidence-informed, patient-centered care while improving practice efficiency.

Selecting the right AI tools requires careful evaluation. Platforms should demonstrate strong data security protections, transparent data handling policies, and reliable performance. User-friendly interfaces and compatibility with existing electronic health record (EHR) systems are also important considerations. By focusing on these factors, practices can explore the benefits of AI while maintaining high standards of patient privacy and clinical integrity.

AI Applications in the Chiropractic Office

Patient Assessment and Diagnostic Support

AI tools have the potential to assist clinicians in organizing information, identifying potential diagnostic considerations, and reviewing medical literature. For example, clinicians may ask AI systems to generate differential diagnoses based on symptom descriptions or summarize relevant research findings. However, clinicians must exercise caution when interacting with AI systems. Most publicly available AI tools are not HIPAA-compliant, and protected health information (PHI) should not be entered into these platforms.

In the future, AI technologies may also improve analysis of imaging studies such as X-rays or MRI scans. Machine-learning algorithms may be capable of identifying subtle patterns that could assist clinicians in evaluating spinal alignment, joint integrity, or soft tissue conditions. While these

technologies are still evolving, they may eventually help clinicians identify musculoskeletal abnormalities earlier and guide more targeted care.

As a simple illustration, when a commonly used AI platform is asked:

“What are the five most common causes of low back pain with one-sided leg pain below the knee?”

Typical responses include: Lumbar disc herniation, Lumbar spinal stenosis, Piriformis syndrome, Sacroiliac joint dysfunction, Facet syndrome.

If the same question is asked but the patient also has a fever, the differential changes to include more serious conditions such as: Spinal epidural abscess, Discitis or vertebral osteomyelitis, Cauda equina syndrome associated with infection, Pyelonephritis, Septic sacroiliitis.

Examples like this illustrate how AI systems can help organize diagnostic thinking. However, these tools should be viewed as clinical support tools, not replacements for professional judgment.

Administrative Efficiency

One of the most common uses of AI in healthcare practices today involves administrative efficiency. AI tools may assist with:

- drafting clinical documentation
- summarizing patient encounters
- supporting coding or billing workflows
- scheduling optimization
- patient communication

AI “scribe” services are increasingly being used in healthcare settings. These systems listen to conversations during patient visits and generate draft SOAP notes for clinician review. Some platforms can also generate treatment plans or patient education materials.

While these technologies can significantly reduce documentation time, clinicians must carefully review all AI-generated content. Errors, inaccuracies, or inappropriate language may occur, and the clinician remains responsible for the final medical record.

Legal and Regulatory Considerations

As artificial intelligence becomes more integrated into healthcare practice, clinicians must remain attentive to evolving legal and regulatory considerations. Doctors of Chiropractic practicing in New Mexico should be aware that the **New Mexico Board of Chiropractic Examiners** regulates chiropractic licensure and professional standards within the state. Although current regulations do not specifically address the use of artificial intelligence tools, practitioners remain responsible for maintaining accurate clinical documentation, protecting patient privacy, and exercising independent clinical judgment.

One important consideration involves the use of AI-assisted documentation systems that record patient encounters. Many AI scribe platforms rely on audio recordings of clinical conversations to generate draft chart notes. Laws governing the recording of conversations vary by state. In New Mexico, recording is generally permitted when one party to the conversation consents. Even in states with one-party consent laws, however, best practice in a healthcare setting is to inform patients and obtain their consent before recording any clinical interaction. Transparency helps maintain patient trust and

reduces potential legal risk.

Clinicians should also ensure that any AI tools used within the practice comply with federal privacy requirements such as HIPAA and follow appropriate safeguards for protected health information. Practices considering AI transcription or documentation tools may wish to implement written consent forms informing patients that AI-assisted technologies may be used during clinical encounters. As with any emerging technology, consulting legal counsel before implementing AI recording or documentation systems can help ensure compliance with applicable state and federal regulations.

Staff Training and Implementation

Successful integration of AI tools requires careful planning and staff education. Clinicians and support staff should understand:

- How the AI system functions
- What information should never be entered into AI platforms
- How to interpret AI-generated outputs
- How to review and validate AI-generated documentation

A gradual implementation strategy is recommended. Practices may begin with limited administrative applications before expanding into more advanced uses.

Establishing clear protocols and monitoring early use can help ensure AI tools improve efficiency without introducing unnecessary risk.

Personalized Treatment Planning

AI technologies also have the potential to support more personalized treatment planning. Machine-learning systems can analyze large datasets containing patient characteristics, imaging findings, clinical outcomes, and rehabilitation progress.

In chiropractic care, where treatment plans are highly individualized, AI may help clinicians analyze patient-specific information and compare it with patterns observed in similar cases. This may help guide decisions regarding rehabilitation strategies, exercise prescriptions, and care progression.

AI-driven platforms may also assist in developing personalized home exercise programs. By analyzing patient mobility, strength, and functional limitations, these systems can generate tailored exercise recommendations and adjust them based on patient progress.

These tools should be viewed as decision-support systems, helping clinicians refine treatment strategies while maintaining full clinical oversight.

Challenges and Considerations

Data Privacy

Protecting patient information remains a critical responsibility when using AI tools. Many publicly available AI systems are not designed for healthcare environments and may store or process data on external servers. Doctors of Chiropractic must ensure that any platform used within their practice complies with privacy regulations such as HIPAA.

Technology Adoption

Integrating AI tools may require investment in new software systems, staff training, and workflow adjustments. Practices should evaluate potential benefits carefully and ensure that technology adoption aligns with the needs of both clinicians and patients.

Clinical Insight: Using AI Responsibly in Practice

Chiropractic care has always been defined by the relationship between the clinician and the patient. While AI tools may enhance efficiency and provide useful insights, they should never replace the hands-on clinical evaluation and personalized care that remain central to the profession. Artificial intelligence can be a valuable tool for improving efficiency in a chiropractic practice, but it should always function as a **clinical support tool rather than a clinical decision-maker**. Doctors of Chiropractic should carefully review any AI-generated documentation, summaries, or recommendations before incorporating them into the medical record or patient care plan.

A practical rule is simple: **AI may help organize information, but the clinician remains responsible for interpretation and final decisions**. Maintaining this balance helps ensure that emerging technologies enhance clinical care while preserving the professional judgment that defines high-quality chiropractic practice.

The Future of Chiropractic Care and AI: A Hybrid Approach

The future of chiropractic practice will likely involve a hybrid model combining the analytical capabilities of artificial intelligence with the clinical expertise and human connection provided by Doctors of Chiropractic.

Practices that thoughtfully integrate AI tools may experience improvements in workflow efficiency, documentation quality, and patient engagement. However, maintaining the balance between technology and clinical judgment will remain essential.

AI systems are powerful tools, but they are not infallible. Algorithms may generate inaccurate information or reflect biases within the data used to train them. Doctors of Chiropractic must continue to rely on their clinical training, experience, and professional judgment when evaluating AI-generated recommendations.

When used appropriately, AI can serve as a valuable support tool that enhances—not replaces—the expertise of the clinician.

American Chiropractic Association (ACA) Delegate Report – February 2026

Dear ACA members,

I had the opportunity to attend ACA’s annual conference, Engage 2026, in January and – as your delegate -- I’d like to share some highlights. As those who also attended the meeting can attest, we accomplished a lot – even with a massive snowstorm bearing down across the country. But first, I urge you to watch ACA’s [Annual Report Video for 2025](#). In the course of a year, we don’t realize how much we as an association get done. To see it all together like this makes me so grateful to be an ACA member and volunteer and to support the work we do on behalf of the profession and, most of all, the patients we serve.

Chiropractic’s Day on the Hill

One of the focal points of Engage is [Chiropractic’s Day on the Hill](#), when ACA members meet with their elected officials and legislative staff on Capitol Hill to lobby for pro-chiropractic legislation. This year, members conducted almost 300 meetings! Our goal was to solidify and expand support for the Chiropractic Medicare Coverage Modernization Act, which was [reintroduced](#) last year and has gained a steady stream of cosponsors from both sides of the aisle. ACA members had many productive conversations on the Hill about the reasons for why the time has come for this bill to pass -- from the ongoing opioid crisis to the aging of the population and the anticipated increase in musculoskeletal conditions that will come with it. Lawmakers we spoke with see the logic as well, so it’s imperative that we all keep our foot on the gas when it comes to H.R. 539/S. 106. If you couldn’t make it to Washington, D.C. during Engage, you can still participate! [Click here](#) to send a message to your U.S. representative and senators and ask them to support access to all Medicare services allowed under chiropractors’ state licensure.

We also learned that the [ACA Political Action Committee \(ACA-PAC\)](#) has contributed over \$125,000 to pro-chiropractic candidates during the current election cycle. John Falardeau, ACA senior vice president of public policy and advocacy, noted that our PAC may not be the biggest in Washington, D.C., but “we play bigger than what we are.” Which makes contributing to the PAC a wise investment for ACA members concerned about future opportunities. Annual Awards

Each year at Engage, we honor ACA members for their exceptional service, achievement, and/or leadership within the chiropractic profession with the [ACA Annual Awards](#). The Chiropractor of the Year Award was presented to **Dr. Ronald Farabaugh, DC**, honoring his efforts to advance the chiropractic profession through integration and research. **Dr. Valerie Johnson** was presented the Humanitarian of the Year Award in recognition of her trailblazing career in the VA. **Drs. Brian Coleman, DC**, and **Nathan Schilaty, DC**, share this year’s George B. McClelland Researcher of the Year Award for their accomplishments in advancing the science around chiropractic. In addition, **Dr. Patrick Battaglia** of the University of Western States was selected as Academician of the Year; **Dr. Brad Russell** and **Dr. Paul Dupuis** were recognized as Delegate and Alternate Delegate of the Year, respectively; and **Dr. Caitlin Simpson** was presented the Flynn-Lynch Award, recognizing a member with no more than five years of experience in the HoD.

David Elton, DC, presented this year’s prestigious **McAndrews Leadership Lecture**. He is CEO of Arete Networks and co-founder of Arete Healthcare, a mission-driven organization dedicated to supporting independent, evidence-based outpatient practices. With more than 25 years of experience in healthcare innovation, Dr. Elton brings deep expertise from past leadership roles within organizations such as UnitedHealth Group. He focused his presentation on the structures, incentives and systems holding back the chiropractic profession. He offered a fascinating look behind the curtain of healthcare network “intermediaries” that, he says, profit from keeping the chiropractic profession isolated — despite the fact that for more than 30 years research has provided solid evidence of its cost savings and effectiveness in resolving musculoskeletal complaints. Dr. Elton emphasized the need for more uniformity in EHR systems among chiropractors as an important step in enabling the profession to do more direct and fair contracting with health plans. “The market wants what you do,” he said. “They just need it in a form they are used to consuming.”

Engage’s Closing Keynote Presentation was delivered by **Brian Coleman, DC, MHS**, a clinician-scientist and assistant professor at the Yale School of Medicine. He discussed the growing impact and uses of artificial intelligence (AI) in the chiropractic profession. He addressed three areas where the use of AI is currently being integrated: clinical practice, research and education. While there is promise in AI’s potential to reduce the burden of tasks such as notetaking and data analysis, keeping up with new research, and clinical training via patient simulations, Dr. Coleman cautions that DCs should strive to continue to amplify the human component of health care. “The patient can disappear in an encounter if we just focus on the data and AI,” he said. However, with “hybrid intelligence,” which for example could involve using AI for data analysis and injecting human empathy and intelligence to add context, Dr. Coleman noted that AI has the potential to contribute to positive outcomes for DCs and patient care.

House of Delegates Meeting

In conjunction with Engage 2026, the ACA House of Delegates (HoD) held a meeting to discuss important issues, hear reports and elect new leadership. The HoD voted to re-elect Drs. Marc Nynas and Maithy Ta to the Board of Governors (BoG) for three-year terms, and they elected **Dr. Crystal Zagwyn** to fill the open seat on the ACA Nominating Committee.

In a subsequent election among BoG members, **Dr. Kris Anderson** and **Dr. Maithy Ta** were elected president and vice president of the association for the 2026-2027 term. Continuing on the board are Robert Ault, DC, MBA; Michael Massey, DC; Marc Nynas, DC; Adrian Stratton, MBA, CPP, PRP; and Michael Welker, DC. Read the [ACA news release](#).

I have been a member of the NMCA since 1968. At that time, the NMCA was a relatively small organization with an annual Convention attendance of around fifty members. The annual Convention was rather portable in those days, and it was common for the Convention to occur in different towns around the state rather than always in Albuquerque. The annual fee for membership, which included the Convention, was \$150.00. The profession was under some pressure in those days as the AMA Committee on Quackery was making a full court press in the media to discredit the Chiropractic profession.

New Mexico has historically been at the forefront of chiropractic innovation and the NMCA has consistently, since the late 1940's, been actively pursuing the goal of enhancing the role of the profession in both state and national politics. Early pioneers like Drs John Q Thaxton and John L Simons were influential in recruiting powerful NM Senators like Clinton P Anderson and Joe Montoya to be champions for chiropractic inclusion in Medicare, which was passed by the US Senate in 1972. The opposition

from the AMA was fierce at the time, especially from the AMA Committee on Quackery.

Advocacy is the cornerstone of potential success. Chiropractic has always been, from inception, an underdog. Historically independent, the profession has slowly but surely established itself as the result of advocating for our right to practice. Advocacy requires an advocate of course. The NMCA has consistently over the decades been a beacon of hope and a champion of the profession in NM. In 1971 NM chiropractors finally passed legislation specifying Doctors of Chiropractic as physicians under the Insurance Equality Act passed by the NM legislature. At the time we were not covered by health insurance and my office visit fee was \$6.00. I was privileged to be the NMCA Insurance Relations Committee Chairman as the act was implemented. The learning curve was steep at the time and of course we all stand on the shoulders of this legislative effort, so long ago, and now take it for granted. Why wouldn't we? It was only right and proper.

Then I am reminded of the Wilk's Trial in

the late 1980's culminating in January 1992 when dedicated advocates sued the AMA for restraint of trade. Prior to this it was unethical for an MD to professionally associate or cooperate with a chiropractor in any way. Winning the lawsuit secured a landmark decision that has forever changed and influenced the status of our profession in the health care delivery system. I recommend to the reader, "Google" the "Wilks Trial" for the history of this landmark case. There were fourteen litigants advocating on behalf of the profession.

Our profession has "backbone" so to speak. The spine and its significance in health is a cornerstone of our identity. Even so, DD Palmer was astute enough to state in "The Chiropractors Adjuster" that the cause of much disease is trauma, poisons and mental/emotional. The 21st century, in addition to the delivery of spinal care, necessitates emphasis on lifestyle, hygiene, nutrition, weight management, stress reduction and exercise from a holistic health care perspective.

In 2008 a dedicated handful of advocates sought NM legislation to enhance the scope of practice for those qualifying themselves through post graduate training. In 2011 legislation was passed by the NM legislature expanding the scope of practice to include certain prescriptive rights. I personally did not seek this right; however, I have supported the

the right of those doctors to pursue an enhanced practice who choose to do so. I am an advocate for the right to pursue career development when one is willing to pay the price of post graduate qualification, training, and certification.

I am an advocate for the NMCA because the NMCA advocates for every member of the profession in New Mexico.

Enuf said.

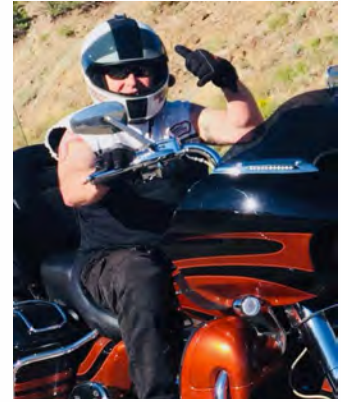

Gerri was preceded in death by her son, Christopher McCallister, and her parents, Eduardo (Pat) and Ernina Romero.

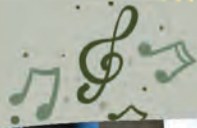

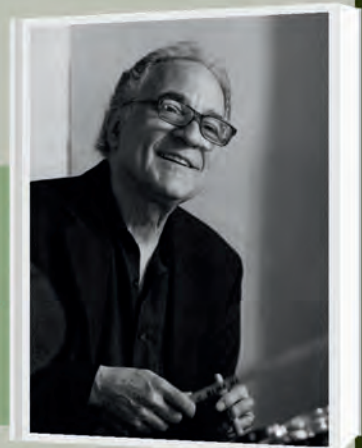
